

4 Best Wall Colors When Staging A Home


Colors can be added to a room in so many ways. Accessories, furniture, art are some examples of bringing in some color which can be changed out on a whim. But when it comes time to select a wall color it can be a terrifying decision for a homeowner. When staging a home to sell, some homes need to neutralize the colors but they don't all have to be "contractor beige." Here are my top four favorite wall colors to work with because they can be used in so many spaces.



Revere Pewter (HC-172) by Benjamin Moore has gray and beige mixed together to give it a great griege color. If you are not a fan of beige, but want some gray, this is a great color for all rooms and can be paired with blues, greens, reds, black and white.



Manchester Tan (HC-81) by Benjamin Moore is a great neutral color for living rooms, hallways and even kitchens. It is a warm neutral color that can be paired with reds, blues, greens and black accents.



Smoke Embers (AC-28) by Benjamin Moore is another great neutral color you can use in a bedroom or living area. In a bedroom, pair this gray with blue or pink accents for a children's room. In a living area, use turquoise or yellow to help wake up the space.



Decorators White (CC-20) is another great neutral color in a living room or kitchen. This white color can also be used for trim or ceiling color as well. Decorator's White does not have any other color tones underneath it whereas some other whites have cream or yellow undertones.



Below are some instances where the colors I recommended were used in a home or office. Top two pictures used Smoke Embers and the bottom two pictures are painted in Manchester Tan. The amount of daylight will also make the color appear lighter or darker.









The colors in this document may not also show correctly on your computer screen. Be sure to view the paint sample in the room you want to paint and with the current lighting.
